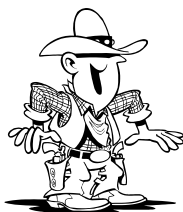
O.F. CAST BULLET MATCH 03/20/13

Other shooters out today were Ron Young, Ronnie Gould, Scott Davis, Carroll Hargrove, and Sonny Odell.

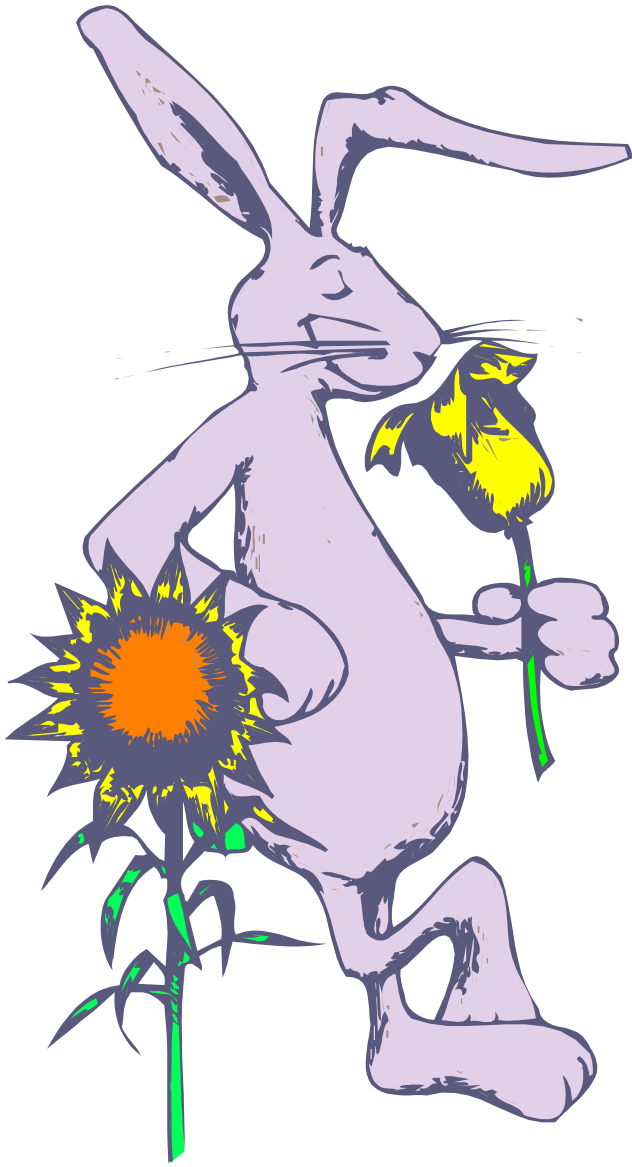


KEY MAILING POSTAGE

If you recall my complaining about the deal we got from the Postal Service wanting keys shipped in a padded envelope (that they sell for \$1.19 each) and \$1.95 postage, well, here's the rest of the story. I found padded envelopes on eBay for about 19 cents each or a dollar cheaper than what the Post Office was selling. Since it was too late to do anything else, the wife and I spent three evenings stamping return address and applying 4 stamps to make up the \$1.95 in postage. This is a set rate for a small package, but they don't have a stamp in that denomination. In fact, they either didn't have or couldn't find a 10 cent stamp.

On my second trip to mail these things, I was informed that postage had gone up to \$2.07 and I would have to add 12 cents more. They still couldn't produce a 10 cent stamp, so I went back home to put three more stamps on the things. So, if you got a small padded envelope about 4"X5" in the mail that weighted less than an ounce and 7 stamps on it, that is why. They almost looked like a Christmas tree. This seems to me to be a bit excessive to mail a key and this situation will be looked into. We've had a couple of suggestions, but others will be appreciated. I would like to look into using the credit card devices that electronically open the gate, but I have no idea as to what the cost would be. Right now, it costs us right at \$10.00 to have a key made and mailed.
